Following the launch of the UQ Global Development Impact Plan 2021-2025, we secured a range of contracts for the design and delivery of tailored short course programs, customised graduate certificate courses and long-term development initiatives in South Asia, Mongolia, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Indonesia, Thailand, Papua New Guinea (PNG) and the Pacific. In addition, the Global Development Hub hosted its Global Development Dialogue 2022 event – Strengthening partnerships with the Pacific - with UQ academic and professional sta engaging with Pacific counterparts in the areas of development practice, government and industry engagement, research collaboration, and teaching.
